### UH STREET RESURFACING PLANNED FOR FALL 2010

The City Council recently passed a bond initiative that includes an estimate of the cost of resurfacing streets in UH. Public Works Director Patrick Ryan advises that the City is currently seeking proposals for conducting the environmental and civil engineering necessary to properly resurface UH roadways. The project should be engineered by the end of June 2010 and work is expected to begin this fall with more work scheduled for the spring of 2011.
